Technical Rules

The technique and the figures should be based according to the Walter Laird's & Guy Howard's books, The Viennese Waltz Script and the appropriate Syllabus

Rosettes - at least 1 figure which could be repeatedly executed throughout the dance (ex. Time Step in Cha Cha)

Bronze - Up to associate level according to the syllabus

Silver - Associate & Licentiate level according to the syllabus

Gold - Associate, Licentiate & Fellow level according to the syllabus.

*Viennese Waltz has no levels according to the syllabus. This dance will be performed only on the "Gold" level

Clothing Restrictions

Small Kids(4-6 y.o.) & Juveniles (7- 12 y.o.) Latin & Ballroom

Girls appearance (Dresses, Shoes and Styling)

- 1. Shiny materials such as shiny fabrics, rhinestones, sequins and sparks are not allowed
- 2. Jewelries are not allowed
- 3. The length of the dress should be up to knee level, to cover the thighs and the glutes. The back and chest area should be covered as well
- 4. White sock should be worn
- 5. The heels of the dancing shoes, should not exceed approximately 3 cm
- 6. The "ballerina bun" should be applied as a hair style
- 7. The makeup that could be applied should look natural

Boys appearance

- 1. Shiny materials such as shiny fabrics, rhinestones, seguins and sparks are not allowed
- 2. Jewelries are not allowed
- 3. White shirt with long sleeves should be worn
- 4.Black tie or bow tie should be worn
- 5.Black shoes with short flat heels accompanied with black socks should be worn
- 6. The hair should be styled with gel or lac
- Juniors and over (over 12y.o.)

Ladies appearance

- 1. The worn dresses should be appropriate to the style (Latin or Ballroom)
- 2. The breast should be covered with the bra cups to not exceed 5cm of the distance between

them

- 3. The glutes, the flex point between the legs and the body should be covered, see-through fabrics shouldn't be applied on the intimate body areas
- 4. Brief style, not skin colour, underwear should be used
- 5. Hair styling should be formal and appropriate to the style of dance (Ballroom or Latin)
- 6. The shoes should be appropriate to the dance style (Ballroom or Latin)

Man's Appearance

- 1.Man's clothing should be appropriate to the dance style (Ballroom or Latin). For ballroom dances men should wear 1.a white long sleeve shirt accompanied with a bow tie 2. Men up to 15 years old could wear a vest 3. Men over 17 years old could wear a black tail suit or a jacket or a vest
- 2.Black or dark tone trousers should be worn
- 3. Hair styling should be formal and appropriate to the style of dance (Ballroom or Latin)
- 4. The shoes should be appropriate to the dance style (Ballroom or Latin)

General rules for Ballroom and Latin

- a. The men/boys could accompany other ladies for partnering although this is possible only in different age groups categories except their own
- b. The participants of couple categories are not allowed to compete in solo categories
- c. The participants of solo categories are not allowed to compete in couple categories
- d. Teachers are not allowed to partner with theirs students

- 1 The duration of the music for the groups will be up to 150 seconds(2mins 30sec)
- 2 Each song/remix should be characteristic according to the dance style.
- 3 The teacher of each group is responsible for production/remix of the composition.

- 4 The teacher is responsible for carrying the music on a usb flash driver
- 5 The music should be uploaded to the registration system along with the registrations of the participants

General Rules

- 1. The choreography could be themed
- 2. The choreography could be synchronized without changes in the formations, or polyrhythmic with changes in the formations
- 3. At least 5 characteristic actions should be included in the choreography according to the dance style(Ballroom, Latin, Caribbean)
- 4. At least 1 of 5 dances should be included in a Latin choreography in Juveniles category and 3 of 5 dances for Juniors, Youths and Adults
- 5. At least 1 of 3 dances should be included in a Club/Social Dance Choreography
- 6. Elements from other dance styles could be used
- 7. Acrobatics are permitted during the performance, although the choreography should not exceed 3 acrobatic tricks in total, which are not allowed to be performed in a single continuation, but they should be split throughout all the choreography. Acrobatic trick is considered when a full frontal or sagittal rotation of a body is done

Small Kids & Juveniles (up to 11 y.o.)

Girls Dresses, Shoes and Styling

- 1. Shiny materials such as shiny fabrics, rhinestones, sequins and sparks are not allowed
- 2. Jewelries are not allowed
- 3. The length of the dress should be up to knee level, to cover the the thighs and the glutes.

The back and chest area should be covered as well

- 4. White sock should be worn
- 5. The heels of the dancing shoes, should not exceed approximately 3cm
- 6. The "ballerina bun" should be applied as a hair style
- 7. The makeup that could be applied should look natural

Boys appearance

- 1. Shiny materials such as shiny fabrics, rhinestones, sequins and sparks are not allowed
- 2. Jewelries are not allowed
- 3. White shirt with long sleeves should be worn
- 4.Black tie or bow tie should be worn
- 5.Black shoes with short flat heels accompanied with black socks should be worn
- 6. The hair should be styled with gel or lac

Juniors and over (over 12y.o.)

Ladies appearance

- 1. The worn dresses should be appropriate to the style (Latin or Ballroom)
- 2. The breast should be covered with the bra cups to not exceed 5 cm of the distance between them
- 3. The glutes, the flex point between the legs and the body should be covered, see-through fabrics shouldn't be applied on the intimate body areas
- 4. Brief style, not skin colour, underwear should be used
- 5.For girls up to 13 years old 1.Shiny materials such as shiny fabrics, rhinestones, sequins and sparks are not allowed 2.Jewellries are not allowed 3.The makeup that could be applied should look natural
- 6. Hair styling should be formal and appropriate to the style of dance (Ballroom or Latin)
- 7. The shoes should be appropriate to the dance style (Ballroom or Latin)

Men Appearance

- 1.Man's clothing should be appropriate to the dance style (Ballroom or Latin). For ballroom dances men should wear 1.a white long sleeve shirt accompanied with a bow tie 2. Boys up 13 years old could wear a vest 3. Men could wear a black tail suit or a jacket or a vest
- 2.Black or dark tone trousers should be worn
- 3. For boys up to 13 years old 1. Shiny materials such as shiny fabrics, rhinestones, sequins and sparks are not allowed 2. Jewellries are not allowed
- 4. Hair styling should be formal and appropriate to the style of dance (Ballroom or Latin)
- 5. The shoes should be appropriate to the dance style (Ballroom or Latin)
